Structural Geology

The Department of Geology invites applications for a visiting appointment at the instructor or assistant professor rank for the Spring 2010 semester. Applicants should be broadly trained in the geosciences with an expertise in structural geology at the M.S. or, preferably, Ph.D. level. At a minimum, applicants should have completed their M.S. degree and be currently enrolled in a Ph.D. program. The applicant will be responsible for teaching a section of structural geology to undergraduate geology majors. The successful candidate will be provided office space and field and lab support to insure the success of the course. This appointment offers the candidate an opportunity to gain experience in teaching undergraduate students in a liberal arts and sciences setting.
